Citizens' State Referendum Number 1

In February 2007, the Utah Legislature passed H.B. 148, Education Vouchers. This bill will take effect only if approved by voters. The bill:

- establishes a scholarship program for:
 - qualifying school-age children who newly enroll in eligible private schools; and
 - lower income school-age children who continue their enrollment in eligible private schools;
- provides for scholarships within that program of \$500 to \$3,000, depending on family size and income, increasing those scholarship amounts in future years; and
- allows school districts to retain some per-student funding for scholarship students who transfer to private schools.

Citizens City Referendum No. 1

Shall Ordinance 06-20 of Syracuse City be approved? The Ordinance was passed in October 2006. Ordinance 06-20 provides language specifying City's form of government. It removes the Mayor's title of Chief Executive Officer. It changes the title of the office of City Administrator to City Manager who reports to the Governing Body as a whole rather than the Mayor only and designates the Manager as the Chief Executive Officer of the City. The Ordinance provides that the City Manager shall review and recommend contracts to the City Council and shall sign the contracts on behalf of the City.

Citizens City Referendum No. 2

Shall Ordinance 06-26 of Syracuse City be approved? The Ordinance was passed in February 2007. Ordinance 06-26 amends the City's beer licensing regulations by creating a license classification to allow beer consumption on licensed premises. The Ordinance requires licensed restaurants be located minimum distances from : public buildings, parks, playgrounds, libraries, schools, and churches. The Ordinance also provides regulations for the issuance of such licenses regarding hours of service, permitted activities, and applicant qualifications.
